A Note
from Our
Pastor...

"You will go out in joy and be lead forth in peace; the **mountains and hills will burst into song** before you, and **all the trees will clap their hands.**" (Isaiah 55:12)

"Let the heavens rejoice, let the earth be glad; let the sea resound, and all that is in it; **let the fields be jubilant**, and everything in them. **Then all the trees of the forest will sing for joy**; they will sing before the Lord, for he comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness and the peoples in his truth." (Psalm 96:11-13)

"**Let the sea resound**, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it. **Let the rivers clap their hands, let the mountains sing together** for you; let them sing before the Lord..." (Psalm 98:8)

"The heavens declare the glory of God; **the skies proclaim the work of his hands.**" (Psalm 19:1)

I love these scriptures because they all tell of nature praising God (in very human ways!) Trees clapping hands! Mountains singing! Heavens declaring and skies proclaiming! It's just so vivid. I can see the trees' newly-green leaves trembling in the wind, and can easily imagine that they are hands clapping for joy! I can hear the wind as it pushes against me as I go on a walk, and can easily imagine a song of praise! And I see the surprise daffodils in my backyard, and I can't help but feel jubilant, even when some things feel so hard.

I say surprise daffodils, because I had no idea they would bloom this year. Yes, we have had daffodils in our backyard before, but we had a landscape company come out last summer and pull out all of our

overgrown wilderness of a yard. They cleared everything out! It has been wonderful to see how much open space we now have, and I continue to imagine playing with Amelia out there – running back and forth across our yard!

But ever since then, the yard has been just grass...until a few weeks ago, when these bold little green branches pushed their way up...and then buds appeared...and now so many beautiful yellow blossoms dot our yard! There's no order to it – in one spot, there are a few single blooms...and clear on the other side of the yard are two gigantic clusters. There's no rhyme or reason to it! They have just bloomed wherever the bulbs ended up when everything else was cleared out!

It is beautiful! And these surprise daffodils have brought me such joy! I was not expecting them at all, and here they are reminding me that God's presence (and love and grace and forgiveness) often find us when we least expect it...and in the most beautifully surprising ways!

And so I wonder, how have you been surprised by God's presence...God's beauty...God's grace...God's love?
