A Note
from Our
Pastor...

As we move from June and into July ... now fully in summer ... I can hardly believe it is nearly Amelia's first birthday! What a year it has been for my little family!

Summer brings many things – longer, and hotter, days ... school breaks ... vacations ... pool days ... holidays ... and now, at least for my family, a birthday! Summer also feels like time moves a little slower. Maybe it is the heat (and humidity) ... or maybe it is just the pace of life. Things do slow down. And yet, there are also more hours of daylight ... more hours to do things!

With all this extra time in the day, I invite you to join me in a summer Bible study! During the months of July and August, join me on **Wednesdays from 9:45 – 11:00 a.m.** to study Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (found in Matthew, chapters 5-7).

More of a collection of Jesus' greatest teachings than a sermon, these few chapters in Matthew are full of wisdom, inspiration, a little bit of challenge, and a reminder of our blessedness ... and so much more!

I have begun preparing for this study by reading a few books. As I said last week in my sermon, I really love to do research, and reading books is my favorite way to do that! I picked up a book that I already had on my shelf – "Sermon on the Mount: A Beginner's Guide to the Kingdom of Heaven" by AJ Levine (one of my professors at Vanderbilt Divinity School). And I ordered another book that came highly recommended – "Jesus' Alternative Plan: The Sermon on the Mount" by Richard Rohr. So far, I am really enjoying both books! And I look forward to diving in to the scripture with you all, too! Feel free to read these books with me, but that is not required in order to participate in the Bible Study.

Each week, we will begin our time with a 15-minute icebreaker/activity to open us up to the theme of the scripture verses we will be studying. Then, we will spend the next hour diving into the text together. It is still an early draft, but this is how I imagine we will break up the three chapters...

July 2 – The Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1-12)

July 9 – Salt and Light (Matthew 5:13-16)

July 16 – "You have heard it said" (Matthew 5:17-48)

July 23 – Murder, Adultery, and Divorce (Matthew 5:21-32)

July 30 – Oaths, An Eye for an Eye, and Love for Enemies (Matthew 5:33-48)

August 6 – Giving to the Needy, Prayer, and Fasting (Matthew 6:1-18)

August 13 – Treasures in Heaven, and Do Not Worry (Matthew 6:19-34)

August 20 – Judging Others, and Ask, Seek, Knock (Matthew 7:1-12)

August 27 – Narrow and Wide Gates, A Tree and Its Fruits, and the Wise and Foolish Builders
(Matthew 7:13-29)

As you can see from just these headings, there is a lot to dig into! I am excited to read and study this with you, and to see how Jesus' teachings still speak to us today! I hope you are, too!

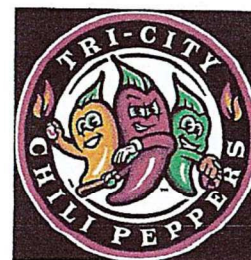
